# LIFE SKILLS AND VALUE EDUCATION

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## MARCH

<b>TOPIC</b>	RESPECT FOR OTHERS

<b>ACTIVITY</b>	Ask each student to maintain a record sheet on which they get remarks from their parents and teachers about their individual behaviour and mode of respect towards each teacher and parent. The student with best remarks would be the winner of this activity. This would enhance their behavioural part.

## APRIL

<b>TOPIC</b>	CONTROLLING ANGER
<b>CONTENT</b>	Why anger is known as one's enemy? Ways of controlling anger.
<b>ACTIVITY</b>	Ask students to make a story about an experience where they had to control their anger or if they couldn't control it and had to face the demerits.
<b>TOPIC</b>	RESPONSIBILITY
<b>CONTENT</b>	What are we responsible for? Why should we be concerned about everything around us?
<b>ACTIVITY</b>	Make a list of things the entire class is responsible for and paste it somewhere in class. Check on daily basis whether you have done it or not and tick accordingly. Divide the students in equal groups and assign each group one poster on which they can paint a message for everyone. Ask them to paste those posters on display boards to make everyone aware of their positive message.

## MAY

<b>TOPIC</b>	QUEST FOR KNOWLEDGE
<b>CONTENT</b>	Without knowledge we stand nowhere. Is it necessary a knowledgeable person is always a literate?
<b>ACTIVITY</b>	Choose an interesting topic and give a detailed speech on it. Then ask students to prepare the same topic with more detailed research and present it in the class. This will increase their quest for more detailed information.

## JUNE

<b>TOPIC</b>	SINCERITY
<b>CONTENT</b>	How sincerity helps us to grow in our lives? Discussion of incidents where we have helped someone and acted as a sincere person.
<b>ACTIVITY</b>	Some students never submit assignments on time and often trail behind entire class in all activities due to laziness. Ask students how would they motivate them and help these lazy students to work better?

<b>TOPIC</b>	COMMON GOOD

<b>ACTIVITY</b>	Ask students to observe everything around them. Then ask each student what do they think is going wrong or which needs to be changed. Make a list of all the problems and tell them to come with solutions in next class. Discuss the solutions and start working on the possible ones.
