The young Debators won the prestigious Nano Nagle Trophy for the second consecutive year, held at Presentation Convent. The topic of the debate was 'Electronic Media Boon Or Bane To The Youth Of



Today.' All reputed schools of the Valley participated. The school was represented by Anika Adfar and Mukarram Wahid. The performance of the speakers was much applauded.

On 2nd June '2012, the young Dipsites added 'Yet Another Feather To Our Cap!' A debate was

organized by the Postal Department , Jammu and Kashmir, in D.P.S. Srinagar with all reputed schools of the Valley including Presentation Convent, D.P.S Budgam, Burn Hall, Tyndale Biscoe, Mallinson, Army Public School who participated enthusiastically. The topic of the debate was 'Is Post Office Relevant in the Modern Era?' Salman Shah from D.P.S. Srinagar bagged the Gold Medal. He spoke against the motion and very rightly said "The post offices today are trying to fix a gaping wound that is bleeding." Ria of Army Public School bagged the 1st position (For) and Kashaf-ul-Khair of D.P.S Srinagar was awarded the third position. Speaking for the motion she emphasized on the point that 'Post offices have generated revenues that have been used for building the nation.' The participants of Biscoe were impressive too. The chief guest Mr. Samuel, the Post Master General was highly

appreciative of the efforts of our school in making the programme a great success.

Firm arguments were raised both in favour and against the motion Zainub Humayun Raina, from DPS, Srinagar emerged as the winner, and was adjudged the Best Speaker, winning the Trophy.

On 12th June 2012, DPS Srinagar made a clean sweep at the Centennial Inter-School Debate held at Mallinson Higher Secondary School. As part of its Centenary Celebrations, a Centennial Inter-School debate was held on the topic "Nostalgic Kashmiriyat - an Illusion or Reality"

Dr Midhat an expert and alumni of Mallinson School was the Interjector. Eight prominent Higher Secondary Schools of Srinagar including two Government



Schools participated in the debate.

The audience poll conducted before and after the debate indicated a tilt towards Kashmiriyat being an "illusion "in the minds of teenagers. Eminent personalities, Dr Isaac Khan, Dr. Mohammed Aslam and Dr. Adil Amin Kak were the judges on the occasion. Both awards were bagged by Delhi Public School, Athwajan. encourage cultural exchange and dialogue, education and development with similar organisations. Its objective being to build up a multi-lingual festival featuring national and international authors in democratic settings with a firm first come first seated policy.

The festival included workshops on everything from mathematics to cartoons, from building alien worlds to recycling paper; as well as story sessions under the banyan tree, puppet shows, and a doodle wall to let imagination take flight! 
students in some creative activities, to make them gain more and more experience in various innovative activities, and to bring out the best in them. The
